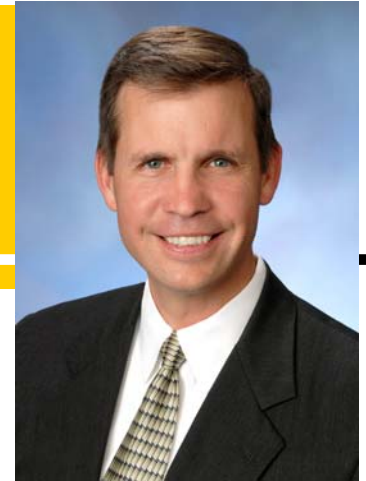

For those of you who asked for yard signs after the Primary, I will deliver the sign

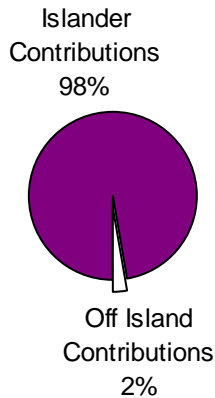
on the 6th.

Again, each yard sign has been personally delivered by me. It's another way to understand the many different areas of the Island.

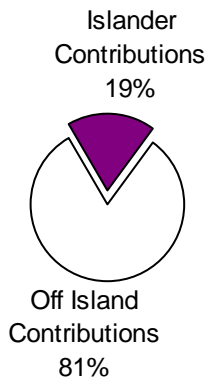

#### Dutch Pancakes

Packed with protein, easy to make but takes a long time because of oven pre-heat and 25 min cooking time.

- 1/3 cup butter            4 eggs
- 1 cup flour                1 cup milk

1. Put butter in a 3 to 4 quart skillet and place in a preheated 425 degree oven.
2. While butter melts, quickly mix batter in blender or food processor. Whirl eggs at high speed for 1 minute, until light and lemony colored. With motor running, gradually pour in milk, then slowly add flour. Continue mixing for 30 seconds.
3. Remove pan from oven and pour batter into the hot, melted butter. Return to oven and bake until well browned, about 20 to 25 minutes.
